ACCIDENT PREVENTION FORUM

When your fearless BARNSTORMER editor asked me to do a monthly column on SAFETY, my first reaction was, "I'll have to get back to you on that." After thinking on it, I realized that I could contribute by being a "horrible example", so I said I'd join the Newsletter Staff..

OK, here's the deal. I'll think up stuff. You are invited to come up with suggestions, solutions, bad examples, etc. Along with borrowing stuff from other newsletters, we should be able to keep an interesting flow of helpful information going.

You've probably been exposed to the slogan, "SAFETY IS NO ACCIDENT"! Right? It's easy to remember and right to the heart of SAFETY as a concept. The key word is "ACCIDENT". Note that there is an "I" in accident! In our case ACCIDENT means: Violent forcible contact of things, or An unexpected, random event. We commonly accept the axiom that "STUFF HAPPENS." However, accidents are usually the result of several minor mistakes arriving in the same place at the same time. With proper information, they can usually be traced to a logical starting point. The point here is: accidents CAN be prevented by US. That accomplished, SAFETY prevails.

There are items we can check before we drive away from home on our way to the flying field. There are inspections that we perform at the field before we launch our marvelous machines into the happy part of our endeavors. There are things we need to do and not do while our planes are up there linked to us by invisible factors. Finally, there are things we need to check after landing, as well as during the cleanup phase, preparatory to loading up and driving away. Some items can be listed on paper and checked off before going to the next step. Stuff to keep in mind during flying had better be committed to memory, as well as having someone beside you to keep track of things that you would not see while focussing on your airplane. I'll try to present the good stuff in a readable fashion, and enough humor to keep you awake. I'll try to keep the dry stuff moistened enough for easy swallowing.

I won't apologize every time I use AEROMODELER JARGON, because it is essential to keep the number of words to a minimum.

ITEM. The Spinner and the Propeller are restrained from rotation independently. First, be sure your propeller fastener is torqued down tightly. Next, be sure the spinner cutouts don't bear against the prop hub and its fastener is tight. If the spinner is loose, the starter will apply shearing force at the prop root, possibly fracturing it, and starting a flying blade accident!
